ADJUDICATORS FOR THE EISTEDDFOD

LUISE HORROCKS

After early studies on the piano and clarinet, Luise Horrocks graduated from Somerville College, Oxford with a degree in English before moving on to study singing on an Advanced Studies Course at the Royal College of Music in London.

She has performed extensively as a Soprano Soloist throughout the UK and Europe. While specialising primarily in Oratorio, she has also given many Song Recitals and has appeared on the opera stage at Buxton Opera House. She has also sung in a series of concerts and Recitals in South Africa and the USA and her wide repertoire extends from works by Monteverdi to Stravinsky. She has made several recordings and her BBC broadcasts include performances of Handel's Messiah, Haydn's Creation and works by Goehr.

Luise has held positions as a teacher in both the Junior and Senior departments of the Birmingham Conservatoire and as a visiting lecturer at Birmingham University. She runs an extensive private teaching practice working both face to face and online and she is regularly asked to give Master classes, workshops, presentations and teacher sessions both at home and abroad. She has worked as a Vocal Coach on several residential courses for singers and as a mentor on the CT ABRSM teacher training course. She has also coached and conducted the Wyre Forest Young Voices choir and worked as an external moderator for Artis, a company providing performing arts projects in schools.

As Associate Chief Examiner in Music for Trinity College London, Luise travelled extensively and worked on syllabus setting, training and standardising the examiner panel, planning and delivering conferences and designing Aural and Improvisation tests. Now working as a freelance consultant, she continues to have special responsibility for singing at Trinity and is leading projects with diploma examiners and teacher support. She has run a series of Trinity singing workshops in Dubai, and publications include a set of books of Musical Theatre repertoire in collaboration with colleague John Gardyne, choosing songs and writing the teaching notes for a new set of graded song books and recently, compiling two books of diploma songs. In 2016 she was awarded an Hon TCL.

She is a highly experienced adjudicator member of the British & International Federation of Festivals and was privileged to be an adjudicator for the inaugural Olga and Jules Craen Young Musician of the Year award in Mumbai, India and for the first Maltese Islands Festival in Valletta, Malta as well as adjudicating and running workshops at the Singapore Performing Arts Festival.

In 2021 Luise qualified as a Vocal Health First Aider.

DEBORAH BALDING-BRITTAIN

For as long as Deborah can remember, music has been a very important part of her life. She started playing the piano at the age of five and became a Junior Exhibitioner at the R.C.M. at the age of 11, before becoming a full time student in 1961, studying piano with David Parkhouse and clarinet with Thea King, having being awarded a Major County Award.

On leaving, she joined the BBC, but on marrying and starting a family, embarked on a very rewarding teaching career. During this time, she also became assistant to the Orchestral Manager of the London Mozart Players, founded by Harry Blech, who was still the driving force behind the orchestra. Leading on from this, she helped in the running of the Serenata of London.

She became an Associated Board Examiner in 1982, examining extensively in UK and overseas. She is also a mentor for the C.T.A.B.R.S.M. Professional Development Course.

In the past few years, she has resumed performing in and around Oxford as well as being asked to adjudicate at Music Festivals, becoming a member of the British Federation of Music Festival.

Classes on 15th and 22nd will be held at The Whitsun Hall, the Hatch Community. Choir classes and the concert will be held in St Mary's Church. The Whitsun Hall is part of the Hatch Camphill Community. Details of classes will be published when all entries have been received. These will include venues, times and names of competitors. If you do not wish your child's name to appear please let us know. They can be listed as 'A.N.Other' or as their initials.

THE ADJUDICATOR'S DECISION IS FINAL

GENERAL RULES

- 1 Please use the official entry form at the end of this syllabus photocopy as many as you need, complete one for each class you wish to enter.
- 2 Entry to venues is not allowed for practice prior to the Eisteddfod
- 3 Please arrive at the hall or the church 15 minutes before your class is due to begin.
- 4 Age limits for solo classes are reckoned as on 31 August 2025 and must be strictly observed.
- 5 Age limits for duet or small ensemble classes should be reckoned by the age of the oldest member on 31st August 2025
- 6 Competitors may only enter **ONCE** in any class and must not perform the same work in any subsequent class.
- 7 Those who have won events in past years must select a different piece for this year.
- The programme will show the order in which competitors will perform in each class.
- 9 The committee will not usually be able to allow substitutes when an entrant is unable to perform except in group entries.
- 10 The committee reserves the right to limit the number of entrants in any one class.
- 11 Additional classes may be created or classes combined at the discretion of the committee.
- 12 In order to abide by the Child Protection rules, the Committee cannot permit any forms of audio, photographic and video recording during any of the performances.
- 13 Evaluation and Marking system:

MARKING SCHEME

DEVELOPING	65-69	A performance demonstrating an awareness of technical skills, requiring more consistency and artistry.
PROGRESSING	70 - 74	A performance showing development of technique and/or communication and commitment
MERIT	75 - 79	A competent performance showing some artistic appreciation and/or technical ability
COMMENDED	80 - 84	A convincing performance technically and artistically, with increasing stylistic and communication skills.
HONOURS	85 - 89	An excellent performance, demonstrating fluent technical and artistic skills with emerging individuality
OUTSTANDING	90 - 94	An impressive performance technically and artistically, Displaying spontaneity and clear individuality.
EXCEPTIONAL	95+	A superlative performance, displaying exceptional artistic Individuality

- Adjudicators will usually announce only the marks of the top three competitors.
- 15 Certificates and mark sheets will be given to all competitors.
- 16 Please would competitors dress smartly.

RULES FOR SPEECH AND DRAMA CLASSES

- 17 The length of time allowed for each performance in each class must be adhered to since exceeding the time limit may result in the competitor being disqualified.

 3 minutes maximum is the time allowed for solo pieces 11 yrs and under,

 5 minutes for solo pieces 12 yrs and over and 10 minutes for group performance.
- Set and Own Choice selections are covered by an agreement with the British Federation of Festivals so competitors need not obtain permission to perform these pieces.
- Only published material is allowed except in the Improvisation Class.
- 20 Sketches are not acceptable.
- Token props and costumes are allowed.
- 22 Competitors must provide a copy of their entry for the Adjudicator on the day.

RULES FOR MUSIC CLASSES

- 23 Backing tracks are not allowed, except where specified.
- 3 minutes maximum is the time allowed for solo pieces 11 yrs and under,
 5 minutes for solo pieces 12 yrs and over and 10 minutes for group performance.
- One piece only to be performed unless otherwise stated. Pieces that exceed the time limit may be penalised.
- The Adjudicator may stop any performance when he/she has formed a judgement or if the time limit is exceeded
- The rules of copyright apply to music.
 - If you select your Own Choice from an album and it is not available as a single copy, you may make one copy for your accompanist provided you have bought the album. The committee steward will keep this copy after the class.
 - Providing Songs from the Shows are sung as a concert item with minimum movement and no costume, copyright permission is not required.
- 28 Competitors must provide a copy of the music for the Adjudicator on the day of the competition for all classes.
- We have an official accompanist who will be available for all classes on request or you may bring your own accompanist. Please indicate on the entry form if you would like our accompanist. There will be a nominal charge for this.
 - If you are using our accompanist you will be sent details so that you can contact him to arrange a practice.
- Some music classes are arranged according to the level at which students are currently performing their musical maturity and are not set in age bands.
 - They should choose an appropriate piece from any suggested syllabus grade but do NOT have to have passed the exam, or to be preparing for it, in order to enter.

TROPHIES

Trophies are awarded to class winners [at the Adjudicator's discretion].

Trophies are held **for ONE YEAR ONLY** and not won outright.

Trophy winners are responsible for the cost of having their names engraved if they so wish.

Return of Trophies:

A recall letter will be sent out to specify where trophies should be returned. Trophies should be returned **cleaned and securely packed** by 31 January of the following year.

Loss or Damage to Trophies:

Competitors are responsible for the safekeeping of the Trophies whilst in their possession, and for reimbursing the organising committee for any loss or damage to the Trophies however sustained.

How long do we keep your information?

Your personal data will not be retained by the Festival for longer than necessary in relation to the purposes for which it was originally collected, or for which it was further processed, subject to certain legal obligation mentioned below:

We will retain personal data in accordance with our data retention policy set out below. We review our data retention periods for personal data on a regular basis. We will hold personal data relating to:

- (a) Your Festival/Eisteddfod entry for 3 years following the end of the Festival/Eisteddfod. Trophy winners' details will be retained until the trophies are returned safely to the Festival.
- (b) Eisteddfod cup winners' names will remain on a list in the TAF archive in perpetuity. This is for historical record purposes.
- (c) Volunteering with the Festival for 1 year following the end of your volunteering with us

NOTES ABOUT MUSICAL THEATRE CLASSES

The emphasis is on a complete performance and presentation, rather than solely a study of music. It can show ability in acting, singing, dancing and choreographic skills.

Performances must show implicit dramatic content with portrayal of characters and their motivations.

This is an opportunity to explore style, form and character through communicating the dramatic content of a musical text.

Minimal props and a suggestion of costume essential to the action or character may be used. Full stage costume may not be used as this may contravene copyright.

Entrants may use a backing track but must provide their own equipment.
